DEC1, DEC2 or DEC3 Which is the course for you?



The **DEC1** & **DEC3** courses are both perfect for those aspiring electricians with some basic knowledge and DIY skills who want to extend these to build a new career in this interesting and very well rewarded sector or perhaps for those working with complimentary trades e.g. Gas Engineers, Plumbers or General Builders who have wider practical experience and who wish to extend their work opportunities and therefore greatly enhance their earning potential. **This is a 13 day course.**

DEC1 is available at Havant training centre & **DEC3** at our Hounslow training centre.

Our **DEC2** course is identical insofar as the qualifications to be gained is concerned. However it includes additional training at the outset with an introduction to the basics of working as a Domestic Electrical Installer e.g. channelling, wire stripping, trunking, fundamental electrical principles and much more. It is intended therefore for those with less relevant backgrounds, probably looking at electrical work for the first time, either as a new career or as an add-on perhaps to something which they already do.

By choosing the **DEC2** option no one need be concerned that they lack the practical knowledge or skills to cope before going on to their technical training as we will provide a sound basic grounding for you. **This is a 15 day course.**

DEC2 is available at Havant training centre only.

There are no formal educational qualifications required to join either of our courses nor do you need any prior electrical knowledge or experience. However it is a technical subject therefore you will need a good understanding of spoken and written English as well as the commitment to study and work hard as this is essential for you to achieve the very best outcomes. It is your dedication and hard work during training which will be the basic building block for your future career.

What qualifications will I obtain?

Over the period of training you will gain all the essential qualifications needed for you to work as a legally qualified, competent and confident Domestic Electrical Installer. Your qualifications will include everything you really need including:

- Domestic Electrical Installer (DEI)/Full Scope Part P. This qualification gives you the core knowledge required to work in the domestic sector under current regulations.
- 17th Edition Wiring Regulations. This qualification is the basis of any electrical career and essential whether you intend to work for yourself or for others.
- Initial Verification and Certification (Inspect & Test) of electrical installations. This qualification is the basis of Inspection & Test in the domestic sector and can lead on later, if desired, to higher level qualifications giving the ability to carry out Periodic Inspection and Testing, Pat Testing and Solar PV to give just a few examples.

In addition to these qualifications those opting for **DEC2** in Havant will also benefit from the additional Centre - designed training program "Introduction To Electricity".



How will I train?



You will attend the Training Centre, for both theory and practical training alongside additional home study allocated by your Tutor. For the **DEC2** course this will always include 2-3 days at the Havant Centre to complete the "Introduction to Electrics" whilst the balance of your course and all of the **DEC1/DEC3** courses will be totally within your chosen centre.

There will be a mix of interim assessments to ensure you are "on track" as you train and summative assessments and technical examinations at the end to complete your course.

Our experience has shown that by far the best way to train into new trade skills is to do so by devoting yourself full time to the task. To minimise the number of days required and therefore the cost to you we do require an amount of home study, homework if you like, but we do not believe anyone truly benefits from the so-called "blended" or "distance" learning approach. This leaves you trying to study a highly technical subject, on your own at home, with only occasional and often highly unpredictable visits to a Training Centre for practical training and revision.

WHAT TYPE OF WORK WILL I BE ABLE TO DO AND WHEN CAN I START?

You will be fully qualified to completely strip a domestic dwelling of all wiring including the consumer unit, re-wire from scratch and replace the consumer unit as required. Any other domestic wiring within a domestic dwelling will also be within the legal scope of your qualifications.

You will be able, in conjunction with membership of a Competent Persons Scheme, to sign off your own electrical work without reference to others. The mark of a competent professional.

WHAT ARE MY FUTURE EMPLOYMENT PROSPECTS?

The overwhelming majority of those who train into the electrical trade go on to become self-employed, either immediately or later on, as this is where the best opportunities for both income and lifestyle can be found. However your qualifications are equally relevant if you choose to work for someone else and will be valued by employers seeking good trade professionals.

Your qualifications will give you a flexible, wide range of options and opportunities to advance your career in the direction of your own choosing.

How will I train?

WHAT IS COMPETENT PERSONS SCHEME MEMBERSHIP?

Under Part P of the Building Regulations all electrical work carried out in special locations within a dwelling must be notified to Building Control. This is normally required to be done by a registered Competent Person and where no additional fees are generally charged. Membership of an approved Competent Person Scheme is therefore an essential requirement for anyone working as a Domestic Electrical Installer.

There are a number of providers of such schemes of which the best known are probably **NICEIC** and **EAL**. You are of course free to choose any scheme provider either in your first year or subsequently. Your options on this will be explained on the course.



Is there a future for me as a Domestic Electrical Installer?

What are my options for funding my course?

Whilst we do not offer any form of financial advice we are aware of the paths other students have followed when looking to spread their costs and we will be happy to relate these to you for your own investigation and decision.



Frequently asked questions

Q. When I finish my course will I be able to work as a qualified electrician?

A. Yes of course. Your exact scope is clearly laid out for you which includes all of the most usual aspects of domestic installation work with options to extend this later on if you choose. You will be able to work for yourself or for others as you decide.

Q. I am completely new to all this and have nothing much from school – can I still do the course?

A. Yes, depending on your background and practical experience you may need either the standard **DCE1** or **DEC3** courses or possibly the extended **DCE2** but one or other will certainly suit you provided you have the required good understanding of spoken and written English plus the commitment to be a diligent, hard working student. We are expert trainers but your hard work is essential if you are to achieve your full potential.

Q. Can I really become qualified in just a few weeks?

A. Yes you can. You will need to be a dedicated and hard working student in-centre and for you to complete diligently any and all additional work your Tutor gives you to complete at home. Because this is an intensive course, without the long breaks involved with distance learning and with continuous support day by day, you will gain knowledge and confidence at a very fast rate. At the end of your course we expect you to be very tired but very happy and very proud of all you have achieved.

Q. Are my qualifications industry recognised?

Q. What happens if I fail an assessment or exam?

A. Don't worry. Assuming you are a dedicated student you should not find any of the assessments or exams too difficult. Remember also that we will be monitoring your progress very closely and will not want to put you in for an exam we do not feel you are ready for. If you need a degree of extra tuition to achieve your pass then, assuming you have been working diligently and trying your best, we will normally (at the discretion of your Tutor) provide it for you.

Q. What happens if I am unemployed?

A. *All the more reason to get onto your course with us without delay! Seriously, there are no support payments available from Government that we are aware of but there is the prospect of a bright future ahead of you if you train with us and we will be delighted to help you seize it.*

Q. How often do your courses run and how many students do you take?

A. *It can vary with demand across the year but we are normally offering start dates at one or more of the Centres each month. We aim for a minimum of 4 people on each course and a maximum of 8 to ensure each student has as much one-to-one tuition as needed to give the best possible outcomes. We are aware others operate with much larger numbers but we choose to put our students first.*


Q. Where are the Centres and will I need to book accommodation?

A. *We currently offer the **DEC1** & **DEC2** electrical training at Havant on the south coast, near Portsmouth and the **DEC3** course from Hounslow (Near Heathrow Airport) Middlesex. Low-cost accommodation is plentiful, if needed, close to all the Centres, you would only need 4 nights each week, but most people find they are close enough to commute.*
